The FC Pop Up Bakery and the Friendship Fellows Program work to provide opportunities for young adults with disabilities to work in the FC office or in paid positions in a bakery setting. Our 14 Fellows and 10 Bakers receive job training, as well as the opportunity to earn income and contribute in their own ways to the greater Pittsburgh community.

While we facilitate friendship and connection, we also INvest together in the community we share. The Friendship Circle provides a variety of opportunities for members, families, and community participants to get INvolved in community service, outreach, and advocacy for inclusion.





Through roundtable discussions led by experts in our community, participants develop leadership skills that better the Pittsburgh community and beyond.



What We Do

The Beacon rests on the foundation of Friendship Circle of Pittsburgh's mission to create a more inclusive community that supports people with diverse abilities and needs. It is a space designed by teens, for teens. The Beacon will offer open hours, in addition to specific programming. The programing will introduce mindfulness and self-awareness to help teens improve their emotional resilience and strengthen their coping capacity. Facilitated by trained staff, we will empower teens to advocate for themselves and one another as they learn to care for their mental health.

In addition to an informal environment and safe space that provides peer and staff support, there will be activities that help members in the following areas:

- Self-advocacy
- Self-care
- Connecting with others
 Finding purpose
- Handling social media
- Setting boundaries
- Mindfulness
- Emotional expression
 Recognizing the need for help

 - Handling anxiety and depression

Activities will be engaging and fun while leaving room for the expression of more difficult emotions. All activities will be adapted for a range of abilities and learning styles. Critical to the success of our mission is the participation of our Teen Wellness Committee. They continue to provide input and make decisions on every facet of the work and space.
